Welcome to the Down Syndrome Queensland, February newsletter! All our services and programs are well underway for 2024. Across the various areas of the business there is a continued effort put into securing grant funding to support DSQ's work. Where possible we seek opportunities in partnership with our counterparts across the Federation. Leveraging each other's strengths assists in furthering our reach into the communities across the country.

A key focus for DSQ this year is to connect more locally with community and health/education professionals in regional areas. The Support Services and Education Services are planning a schedule to commence towards the end of quarter 1.

At the end of 2023, the Programs area successfully completed delivery of the first Possibility Pathways Program. The Possibility Pathways Program is a Government funded program through the Skilling Queenslanders for Work Initiative. The program aims to help develop the foundation skills to support young people with an intellectual disability so they may pursue their career aspirations to further training, employment or improved job roles. Sleep In Children With Neurodisability: Final Study Recruitment

Participate in the University of Queensland's national study that is evaluating sleep in children with Neurodisability!

The study aims to better understand parental perceptions and current community management of sleep problems for children with neurodevelopmental disorders. This research will pave the way for better understanding of sleep problems in children, improve treatment protocols and overall outcomes for patients who struggle with various aspects of sleep.

On Friday March 1st, the Down Syndrome Queensland Education Team will present an Inclusive Unit Planning workshop for educators who are teaching or supporting learners with Down syndrome and/or another intellectual disability. This practical workshop will take participants through a step-by-step process of writing an inclusive unit for diverse students, including adjustments for individual students. Participants will leave with a draft of a new unit plan, aligned with the Australian Curriculum, that enables learners with Down syndrome and/or another intellectual disability to be learning the ageappropriate curriculum unit "on the same basis" as their peers, supported by reasonable adjustments.

This workshop is suitable for P-12 classroom teachers, HOSES, Inclusion teachers, Learning Support teachers, and curriculum leaders.

The workshop will be run by Dr Carly Lassig (DSQ's Lead Education Consultant and Senior Lecturer at Queensland University of Technology), and the DSQ Education Team, who have extensive and varied teaching experience in mainstream and special schools.

Places are limited and registration closes on the 23rd of February, so get in quick! We hope to see you there.

Join the Possibility Pathways Program

PROGRAMS

Enrolments for our Skilling Queenslanders for Work Initiative, Possibility Pathways Program, is currently open and we are looking for people to join our second cohort for 2024!

This 8-week program aims to support young people with an intellectual disability to prepare for sustainable mainstream employment and beyond. Through engagement in our program, we believe that students will develop the fundamental skills to pursue their career aspirations and increase their likelihood of transitioning to further training and employment or improved job roles.

The program includes components of foundation skills such as reading, writing, oral communication and numeracy. Foundational skills are embedded into a curriculum of topics critical for and tailored to this priority group of people with intellectual disability, and responsive to the barriers they face to employment and other pathways.

The next cohort will begin on Monday 29th April until Tuesday 18th June 2024.
