Employment Update

Wow – it is difficult to believe that we are very quickly coming to the end of the first year for Jennifer and I with the Information Service SA – Down Syndrome Australia! I would like to reiterate Jennifer’s words above about the gratitude that we have for the South Australian Down syndrome families and community for the support and engagement that has occurred since the service began in February this year.

2025 Recap:

It has been wonderful to have the opportunity to meet and get to know many of our members and their families through the many and varied opportunities that we have had to come together during 2025.

Some of my favourite times have been the Celebration of World Down Syndrome Day at Government House in April where around 150 members of our community were so warmly welcomed by Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC (the donuts so kindly donated by Vill’s Bakery were a highlight also!). I also loved meeting some of the younger families and their families at the ‘Picnic and Play’ at the Orphanage Playground in July.

Speaking in August to over 200 postgraduate medical students from Flinders University with other families covering everything from healthcare to inclusion and everyday challenges. Knowing that our future Doctors will walk away with greater understanding, empathy and insight into the value and potential of people with Down syndrome was truly empowering.

Providing information and opportunities for our SA community to connect with DSA,

educational webinars and fun opportunities within our community ie: SACID workshops about Employment, Toileting Workshops and The Growing Space online workshop 'Can I Still buy It? Funded by the Scap Heap Adventure Grant that we were successful in procuring. We have also enjoyed celebrating significant days on the world calendar.

Employment Connector Program:

We have supported our community members from the Bedford community through a difficult time and lobbied for the support of this workplace through all possible channels. We have employed 3 Employment Ambassadors to represent our community, and I would like to thank Isaiah Caruso, Joseph Russell and Mia Johnson for their work and I look forward to continuing to work alongside you in 2026! We have supported community members to look for employment opportunities and have worked to procure employers to employ people with Down syndrome in open employment positions.

State Disability Inclusion Plan:

Our Employment Ambassadors and a small group of community members attended the State Government Launch for the State Disability Inclusion Plan 2025 - 2029 in August. Thank you to Robyn Blundell for her support in working with myself and the Department of Human Services Principal Project Officer for Disability Policy and Reform Inclusion and Safeguarding throughout the consultation and draft policy process. This enabled us to share information from our community and have a voice as major stakeholders.

Fiona McBurney Match Day Experience:

We have worked with the AFL and SANFL Umpires Association to enable 4 individuals to support the AFL Umpires at football games this year through the Fiona McBurney Match Day Experience opportunity. 
