Employment Coordinator News

The past couple of months have seen some terrific opportunities for our South Australian Down syndrome community to come together to connect and engage. Most recently around 150 people gathered on the lawns of Government House on a sensational Saturday morning to share morning tea with Her Excellency The Governor of South Australia France Adamson AC. The Morning Tea provided an opportunity for families to reunite in a fun way to celebrate 'World Down syndrome Day' 2025. It was fabulous to see people of all ages attending supported by their families and support networks.

The Governor welcomed everyone with a short speech and spent time greeting families throughout the morning. The Governor spoke about the fact that this is a really exciting time in South Australia as we look to reform a community-based association to offer opportunities to our community. This was tremendous affirmation as the association will aim to help form partnerships within our community, to support and influence social and policy change, to support a life of possibilities and to enable individuals living with Down syndrome to have a voice.

The theme for World Down Syndrome Day 2025 was "No Decision Without Us" Inclusion will never be possible if the decisions that shape the world are made by only a few, for a few. From having a say in everyday personal choices to being involved in writing laws and policies, people with disabilities demand a seat at the table where the decisions are made so that everyone's opinion is heard and the world is finally all for all.

The appointment of myself and Family Support Officer Jennifer McCullough to support the South Australian community to reconnect and to provide opportunities to empower individuals and their families and support networks to live their best lives is exciting. Jennifer and I are working to do this through family support, networking and employment opportunities and training. It is our aim to be visible within the community and to change attitudes , perspectives and perceptions. We look forward to creating a safe inclusive 'space' where our community belongs and can provide support for each other and show the world what is possible.

On March 21st 13 young adults and their support crews were treated to a Pamper Morning at Hair Care Adelaide sponsored by the Gauvin Group. It was a fabulous morning where participants (and their Carers) had their hair washed, styled, coloured, curled and cut! We were treated to a delicious morning tea and got to meet some incredible people who all donated their time so that our group could enjoy a morning of luxury! What way to celebrate WDSD and to make new friends!
