The **Health & Education Ambassador** will talk to health professionals about people with Down syndrome.

This is a paid position.

It is a casual job.

A **casual job** means you will be paid for the hours you work.

It will be about 4-8 hours per week.



Here is what the Ambassador does in this job:

The Ambassador will:

- Go to meetings with health professionals.
- Prepare for meetings.
- Read and add notes to meeting agendas.



A meeting **agenda** is a list of what you will talk about in the meeting.



The Ambassador will:

- share their experiences
- give advice
- talk about how to best work with people with Down syndrome.



The Ambassador will:

- develop their stories to share in workshops.
- Give workshops to health professionals.



The workshops will be:

- Online
- Face to face



The Ambassador will:

 Help make resources, like a video or factsheet.



Here are the skills you need for the job:

- You have Down syndrome.
- You are 18 years or older.
- You are interested in having a say for people with Down syndrome.
- You can work as part of a team.
- You can work at the office.



To do this job:

 You must be prepared to share your stories about the best way to work with people with Down syndrome.



To do this job:

• You must attend meetings and training as required.



To do this job:

 You must be willing to do videos for websites.



To do this job:

 You must have the Covid and flu vaccinations or letter from your doctor.



We will provide help and support to prepare for meetings and workshops.



We will provide training to help you in this role.



All communication types are welcome and we will support those who talk or talk in different ways.
