


CEO's Corner

End of Financial Year

With just a day to the end of the 2023 financial year, this year's EOFY campaign has received \$2936 of donation from 14 members and supporters of the association. DSWA does not charge membership fees and not all of our services and activities receive funding, and grants do not cover operational costs like paying the lease or electricity bill, so your donations support us to be able to continue to provide support and services to the community.

Every small donation is precious and does make a difference. We know not everyone can donate now, and we are so grateful for the support we receive in other ways like sharing our social media posts, supporting us at events and making donations and commitments at other times of the year.

We know that support is required by our members across their lifespan at different times, and now with DSWA expanding our services and information including our support to families experiencing Down syndrome regression disorder and our new Dementia support group, we are continuing to respond to the community as we can.

We have also been incredibly fortunate to receive a donation of \$10,000 from the Perth Mint who are also a very strong supporter of the DSWA employment program. We are grateful to the Perth Mint for their ongoing support of both the employment program and the work of the association.

SLES Program Coming Soon

In response to a number of requests from families of children who finished school last year or are finishing this year, we have reviewed the SLES requirements and are thrilled to announce that DSWA will be formulating and delivering a formalized SLES program commencing in September 2023. We have been delivering SLES to two families this year, and it has worked very well. We will be in a position to offer a range of SLES related services, and Finding and Keeping a Job activities later this year.

We will be formulating the service outcomes over the next few weeks and will be sending out more information soon. To help us design the service for the first group of participants, I have attached an Expression of Interest form for you.


