Dylan shared their experience which spoke warmly to the employers in the room. This month I also had a chance to drop in to PCH to visit one of our members now working with the T21 Clinic. It was great to see the positive interaction and impact she is having.

Strategically, we have just begun working on the next strategic plan for DSWA and will be engaging with you in the next 6 months to have your say on our future direction. It is an exciting time as we start future activities and deliver the strategy in what will be our 40th year. 2026 will mark the 40th Anniversary of DSWA and throughout the next 6 months, we will be connecting with members across all ages for your input, and particularly with founding and early families to speak to the history of this incredible association that was formed by their love and dedication.

We continue to apply for grants, seek philanthropic partnership and to form greater partnerships with employers, volunteers and community partners to continue DSWA's exciting growth and development. On Wednesday 27th August we were lucky enough to have ScamNet WA provide an online webinar for us on Scams and how we can all be safer online. ScamNet WA talk to lots of different organisations about scams and are keen to reduce the number of incidents across WA by sharing ready to use tips that you can apply right away.

The session provided members an insight into the types of scams that exist and how they are part of everyday life, from texts claiming you have missed a parcel to emails with someone pretending to be your bank.

Most people reading this have probably seen a scam in the past year, the best way to protect yourself is by being aware and not falling for the urgency or rush that scammers try to make us feel by saying things like "act now your bank account has been hacked".

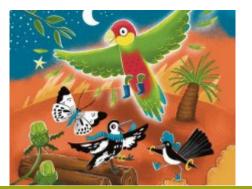

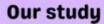
